

LRHS Scholarship Bulletin February 2023

This bulletin is not meant to be an all-inclusive list of scholarship information. It only contains information on scholarships that we have received at the school. It often does not contain college/university specific scholarships, unless it is a college/university scholarship that requires a specific nomination from Leesville. Students are encouraged to look at the websites for the colleges to which they are applying for specific scholarship information.

- 1. State Employees' Credit Union "People Helping People" Scholarship This \$10,000 scholarship is open to any senior who meets the following criteria:
 - Is either an SECU member or is eligible for membership through a parent/guardian (This must be verified before you can apply)
 - A minimum 2.5 GPA
 - Identifies a financial need as determined by submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Documented acceptance at one of the 16 public universities in North Carolina
 - Legal Residency in North Carolina and U.S Citizenship
 - An agreement to attend the same public university for eight consecutive semesters
 - **<u>OUTSTANDING EVIDENCE</u>** of leadership, character, integrity, and community involvement
 - Is not an employee or family member of an employee of the State Employees' Credit Union

Leesville's scholarship committee can select a primary nominee and a secondary nominee for this scholarship whose information will be sent to a committee at Central Office for the final selection process.

Interested seniors should email Mr. Greene, egreene@wcpss.net by February 16 to receive the application instructions.

- Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Scholarship- This \$1000 scholarship is open to minority male or female students who have at least a 3.3 unweighted GPA and plan to attend college in the Fall of 2023. The Application can be found <u>HERE</u>. Students may contact their counselor for a signed copy of their transcript which must be uploaded as part of the application. The deadline to apply is March 1.
- 3. Christine Council Foundation Scholarship- Christine Council was a devoted mother, grandmother and friend who lost her battle with breast cancer in 2003. Her son graduated from LRHS, and this \$2000 scholarship is in her memory. Documents required for this scholarship are:
 - a. A minimum 2.8 GPA
 - b. A transcript
 - c. A college acceptance letter
 - d. One-to-two-page personal statement including personal history, education, and career goals. In this essay, applicants must exhibit determination, community service and resilience.
 - e. One letter of recommendation from teacher, coach, or community leader.

All required documents must be emailed to <u>christinecouncilscholarship@gmail.com</u>. The deadline is March 31. Mr. Greene, <u>egreene@wcpss.net</u>, is willing to help students compile these documents and assist in sending them.

- 4. Assistance League of the Triangle Scholarship- This scholarship is open to any senior planning to attend college. Applications can be found here: <u>http://altriangle.org/philanthropic-programs/scholarship/</u>. The deadline to apply is March 1.
- 5. <u>GSK Opportunity Scholarship</u> is available to US citizens who are residents of Durham, Orange, or Wake County and have overcome significant adversity. Scholarships are valued at \$5,000 per year, renewable for up to four years, for a total award up to \$20,000. Recipients must attend a public state university or community college in North Carolina. - 6. <u>Benjamin F. Ward Scholarship</u> honors Mr. Ward's extraordinary commitment to teaching and community service by providing financial assistance to graduating high school seniors in Durham, Orange, Wake, or Chatham counties intending to attend a North Carolina college or university full-time. Recipients will be selected based on financial need and commitment to community service and involvement. Scholarships are valued at \$2,500 per academic year for up to four years for a total award of \$10,000. Applications can be found at: http://trianglecf.org/award/benjamin-f-ward-scholarship/ Applications are due March 1.
- 7. Light on the Hill Scholarship will award 10 scholarships to African American students who will enroll at UNC for fall 2020. Awards will be based on Academic Achievement, Evidence of community services, Leadership Qualities, and Strength of Essays. - The Woman's Club of Raleigh is offering two scholarships to graduating seniors. The scholarships are valued at \$1000. Applicants must plan on attending college or university in North Carolina. Applications can be found at: https://womansclubofraleigh.org/community-service/scholarships/ The deadlines vary depending on the scholarship.
- 9. Alpha Delta Kappa Scholarships- Every year, this organization awards three scholarships of \$2000 each to qualifying seniors on track to graduate and planning to attend a 4-year college or university.
 - The Eunice Riggins Memorial Scholarship is open to any young woman who expects to enroll in a four-year college or university in North Carolina next fall. Specific eligibility requirements are: Academic rank in top 10% of class, Minimum SAT score of 1220 or ACT composite score of 25, good character and participation in extra-curricular activities (school and community). Financial need is not the primary consideration. Apply here: https://apply.mykaleidoscope.com/scholarships/EuniceRiggins2023 The deadline is March 1.
 - The Mary Rose Mills-Linda Rankin Memorial Scholarship is open to any student who expects to enroll in a four-year college or university next fall. Specific eligibility requirements are: Academic rank in top 10% of class, Minimum SAT score of 1290 or ACT composite score of 27, good character and participation in extra-curricular activities (school and community). Financial need is not the primary consideration. Apply here: https://apply.mykaleidoscope.com/scholarships/MaryRoseMemorial2023 The deadline is March 1.
 - The Clare Johnson Marley-Mary Earle Berger Fine Arts Scholarship is open to any student who expects to enroll in a four-year college or university next fall, and who is declaring as his/her major in an area of the fine arts. Specific eligibility requirements are: Academic rank in top 20% of class, Minimum SAT score of 1220 or ACT composite score of 25, good character and participation in extra-curricular activities (school and community). Financial need is not the primary consideration. (Samples of talent are required to be submitted with the application.) Apply here: https://apply.mykaleidoscope.com/scholarships/clarejohnsonscholarship23. The deadline is March 1.
 - North Carolina Alpha Delta Kappa Student Achievement Scholarship. Open to a male or female, on track to graduate and planning to attend a 2-year or 4-year college or university. Specific eligibility requirements are: SAT score of 990 to 1130 or ACT composite score of 20 to 24; unweighted GPA of 2.5 to 3.5; good character, integrity, leadership potential and service to school, community, and church. Students should apply for this scholarship through the North Carolina Community Foundation at www.nccommunityfoundation.org.
- 10. **Hugh Morson Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship is open to any senior planning to attend college, has at least a 2.5 GPA and has demonstrated traits of high personal character and leadership. Applications can be found at: <u>www.csascholars.org/mrsn</u> and the deadline to apply is March 30.

11. Sigma Scholars Inc. Scholarship- The newly established Sigma Scholars Inc. 501 (c) 3 foundation was established to provide scholarships to deserving Wake County Schools Seniors who have been accepted and who have committed to attending a Two-Year College (Associates Program) or Four-Year College (Bachelors Program) after graduation from High School. MIDYEAR TRANSCRIPTS

- ✓ If you applied to a college using the Common Application, your counselor will upload your updated transcript by mid-February.
- ✓ If you need a midyear transcript sent to a college or university <u>in North Carolina</u>, and they do NOY use the Common App, you may request this through your CFNC account.
- ✓ If the college or university needs an updated transcript and is outside of North Carolina, continue to use the SCRIBORDER Website: <u>https://wcpss.scriborder.com/</u>
- ✓ Many colleges and universities ask that you self-report your 1st semester grades. If this is the case, then you would not need to request a transcript.
